

# GreenNet via Cellphone

Glastonbury Festival 89, an annual fund-raiser for the British Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament, attended by 50,000 people, saw the first known use of GreenNet through a cell-phone. Apart from the usual type of initial misunderstandings and hassles with missing bits of thingy, it was found to be no problem. We used a generator for power (though a windmill would have done, but was being used for a band), and a radiophone (with a special interface to the modem) kindly provided by CBA Datapath.

This demonstration of both the intrinsic potential of GreenNet and its availability in the absence of mains power and phone lines was dreamed up and realised by Mike O'Connell of The Spirit of Conservation Mobile. This is a display unit in a small articulated truck which argues the case against nuclear power from place to place around Hinkley Point. GreenNet would like to record its appreciation

## ...now we are six!

The network of computers running the same email and conference facilities as GreenNet has doubled in size in the last two months! GreenNet users can now communicate as easily with users of **PeaceNet Sweden (pns)**, **Nicarao (ni)** in Nicaragua and **Alternex (ax)** in Brazil as they can with other GreenNet users, and with **PeaceNet (pn)** or **EcoNet (en)** users in the US or **Web** users in Canada.

Most of the conferences will be shared across all six nodes (host computers), allowing users of any node to participate as though they were all on one big system. To exchange e-mail between users on different nodes a simple prefix is all that is needed in addition to their username - see box below.

### Prefixes for all existing nodes:

PeaceNet	pn:
EcoNet	en:
WEB	web
PNSweden	pns
Nicarao	ni:
Alternex	ax:
GreenNet	gn:

(Note - pn:, en:, cdp:, and igc: are all interchangeable prefixes for PeaceNet or EcoNet.) Typical example:

From: gn:nicasol
To: ni:sandino pn:carnet

If you are sending e-mail to someone on the same system, you don't need to use the prefix (e.g. To: fred) but it doesn't matter if you do.

## ...and soon to be seven -

From September there will also be a node in Australia, run by Pegasus Networks. As soon as it is up and running we will announce the details on-line, and let you know what the prefix is for e-mail. Faxes and telexes are charged to you at cost: a guide to the approximate costs can be found under the topics for fax and telex in the conference gateways, along with instructions on exactly how to send them through GreenNet.
- You can always request new conferences! If you think that there is a subject area missing, you could be right! We depend on our users to initiate conferences when necessary. You can make suggestions in related conferences and in ideas. Information on starting conferences is in facilitators. For more help send e-mail to support.
- If you are unsure of procedures for uploading and downloading (very important for economical use of GreenNet) you can use the conference test for testing. And you can get advice by e-mailing support.
