Read Conference Messages

- u** show next (U)nread message
- t** show next unread (t)opic
- i** (i)ndex page of conference topics
 - b/f** (b)ackward/(f)orward one page
 - </>** first index page/last index page
- n/p** (n)ext/(p)revious message
- r** (r)edraw the message
- back up to last seen message
- c** (C)apture toggle:
 - d** (d)ownload message or
 - p** toggle (p)age mode
- #** read topic # (type actual number, not the # symbol)
- #. #** read response # of topic # (type actual number, not the # symbol)

Writing Conference Messages

- w** (w)rite a topic/response or send mail
 - n** (n)ew topic or new mail message
 - r** (r)espond to a topic or mail reply
 - s** (s)end copy of message as mail
- d** (d)elete a message that you wrote

Other Conference Commands

- g** (g)o to a conference
- l** (l)ist conferences
- v** (v)isit regular conferences
- m** (m)aintain list of regular conferences
 - a** (a)dd conference to regular list
 - d** (d)elete conference from regular list
- x** e(x)it conference
 - f** (f)orget you read anything
 - p** (p)retend you've read everything (useful when joining a conference)
- h** (h)elp on conference options
- q** (q)uit from conference mode

Editing Commands

- a** (a)dd text
 - c** (C)hange text pattern
 - f** (f)ormat entire text
 - r** (r)eview/search text
 - v** (v)iew entire text
 - q** (q)uit from editor
 - u** (u)pload a file from your computer
- <CTRL-U>** erase current line
- <CTRL-R>** replot current line (useful after erasures or modem noise)
- <CR>.<CR>** back to "Edit?" prompt
- <CTRL-D>** back to "Edit?" prompt
- <erase>** erase previous character (usually the Backspace or Delete key)
- <CR>** completes/accepts line; go to next line

EcoNet's Quick Reference Card

- Commands usually require only the first letter.
- <CR> means press the "return" or "enter" key on your keyboard.
- <CTRL-X> means press the "control" key while typing an x (or whatever letter is designated).
- Press <CR> after all commands.
- Type a ? to see a list of your options at any command.

Communication Parameters

For mainland U.S. access only.

- 7 Data Bits
- 1 Stop Bit (2 Stop Bits at 300 Baud)
- Odd Parity
- Xon/Xoff
- Full Duplex
- No padding or delay for CR or LF

Logging In

For 1200 baud:

Terminal = <CR>

```

For 2400 baud:

```
connect @ <CR>
Terminal = <CR>
@ C 408346
408 346 CONNECTED
login: (? for help):
```

International access:

```
Network User Address (NUA): 311040800346
(NUA may be preceded by a 0 or 1, check with
your PTT)
```

Main Command Line

(c)onf conferences
(h)elp online help
(m)ail electronic mail
(s)etup modify password, terminal type, delete key
(u)sers directory of users
bye log off the system (you must type all three letters)

Setup Commands

s (s)how current terminal type setting
tl (t)erminal (l)ist of all the valid terminal types
t [type] set (t)erminal type (type actual terminal type)
d change (d)elele key
p change your (p)assword

General Useful Commands

<CTRL-S> stop screen scrolling
<CTRL-Q> resume screen scrolling
? list of command options
h (h)elp explanation
q (q)uit from activity

Mail

Reading Mail

u read next (u)nread message
n read (n)ext message
p read the (p)revious message
read message # (type actual number, not the # symbol)
i* show (i)ndex of mail messages
r* (r)ead current message
c (c)apture toggle:
d (d)ownload message or
p toggle (p)age mode

Sending Mail

w (w)rite reply to mail message/new message/send copy:
r (r)eply to last message
n send (n)ew message
s (s)end copy of message

Other Mail Commands

d* (d)elele current message
und (un)detele current message
l (l)ist mail folders
s* (s)ave message in folder
g (g)o to a mail folder
h (h)elp on mail options
q (q)uit from mail (to main command line)
x e(x)it folder (forget deletions and which messages were read)

* These commands accept qualifiers.
